
GUATEMALA FORGERIES AND FAKES 1930 SCOTT 252-4


The 1930 Ferrocarril de Los Altos issue was the first issue of stamps printed by Tipografia Nacional. They were printed in very small quantities of from 25,000 to 50,000.

Fakes of this issue appeared at some later date. The fakes were first reported by Roger Frigstad in 1964, who believed that they were fairly scarce.¹ No fakes have been reported used on cover.



The fakes are most easily distinguished from originals by comparing the imprint at the bottom of each stamp. The genuine have even and clearly printed lettering, the fakes have very coarse lettering. Other differences include the lines framing the vignettes which are fine in the genuine and coarse in the fakes, and the colors of the stamps defined by Frigstad

referring to the Stanley Gibbons color guide which was also used throughout Guatemala 2 ("G2").² G2 states that the inks of the genuine are fugitive which makes reliance on the color unreliable.
